Symptoms & Signs

A-Symptoms:

- 1-Itching
- 2-Pain
- 3-Crawling sensation
- 4-burning sensation
- 5-Hypersthesia
- 6- Anesthesia

B- Signs(skin lesions): these are divided into :

A-Primary Skin Lesion

Physical alteration of the skin --- caused directly by the disease

- 1-macule: circumscribed flat discoloration < 1 cm in diameter(Fig:1)
- 2-patch: Circumscribed flat discoloration >1cm (large macule)
- 3-papule: superficial solid localized elevated lesion up to 1 cm(Fig:2)
- 4-plaque: Superficial elevated solid lesion with flat surface > 1 cm(Fig:3)
- 5-Nodule : circumscribed deep solid lesion > 1 cm in diameter(Fig:4)
- 6-vesicle: circumscribed collection of free clear fluid <0.5 cm(Fig:5)
